ART PROJECT DESIGN

Through CBP funding partners, JP Morgan Chase Foundation and ArtsinStark an art project has been approved by a committee of residents from The Boulevards to be placed on two median strips along 19th and Edwards NE. The artist working with the committee and project designer is local artist, Vicki Boatright. Over the past couple of months Ms. Boatright has been collecting information from the committee about the history of The Blvds., memories and descriptive words that define their neighborhood. The designs (see below) that Ms. Boatright created clearly captured the committee's input. This art project in conjunction with 5 additional art projects throughout the City, supports the CBP neighborhood strategies of resident involvement with a clear emphasis on image building.

Each design represents a cutout image on wood that will be painted with bright colors by residents. To maximize space, two fence structures will be constructed to showcase four designs; one on the North median strip and one on the South. Each cutout image will be mounted to the fencing structures. Each image has a house with a heart and a hand in it. This represents: 1-home (house) 2-care for the sustenance of the community (heart) 3-Individual commitment to lend a hand to the overall community (hand).
